The Tattnall County Commissioners met in Regular Session with the following Members present: Chairman Jackie C. Trim; Bobby Kennedy, Herbert (Bubba) Burkhalter, Wayne Tatum, Edward Kennedy and GW Thompson.

Staff present: Frank H. Murphy, County Manager; Christy D. McCall, County Clerk; Kenny Hicks, Road Superintendent; Kyle Sapp, Sheriff; Dennis Odum, County Engineer; Walt Rogers, EMA Director; Monica Douglas, 911 Director; Blake Monroe, EMS; Coy Tippins, EMS; and Joseph McGovern, County Attorney.

Others Present: Tom Rhodes of Flint Equipment and Jason Benton of Yancey Brothers.

Chairman Trim called the Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Trim then gave the invocation.

Chairman Trim presented the consent agenda for approval. Consent agenda included the following:

- Regular Meeting Minutes, June 11, 2018
- Budget Amendments (Copy attached)

There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2nd by Commissioner GW Thompson to accept and approve the consent agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

New Business

1. Chairman Trim called for approval of the agenda.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2^{nd} by Commissioner Bubba Burkhalter to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

2. Chairman Trim presented the 2008 Ford Diesel truck (Old Solid Waste truck), Vin# 1FTX20R88EC16563 for surplus.

County Manager, Frank Murphy stated the truck is leaking oil along with other possible issues. The truck was originally purchased for around \$8k and now has 150k miles on it.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2^{nd} by Commissioner Bubba Burkhalter to approve the surplus sale of the 2008 Ford Diesel truck, Vin#1FTX20R88EC16563. Motion carried unanimously.

3. Chairman Trim next presented the 2012 Ford Ambulance, Vin # 1FDRF3GTXCEBB1599 for surplus.

Mr. Murphy stated the engine is blown in the ambulance and the box is a 2003 model, which is dated.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bubba Burkhalter and 2^{nd} by Commissioner Wayne Tatum to approve the surplus sale of the 2012 Ford Ambulance Vin # FDRF3GTXCEBB1599. Motion carried unanimously.

4. Chairman Trim presented the next item to purchase a water truck. This was also presented during the June Commissioner's meeting. However, water truck that was approved, was not satisfactory during demonstration and no purchase was transacted. Chairman Trim stated that after reviewing the two bids, which were very high, he recommends that the Board table this item to allow time to collect better prices.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2^{nd} by Commissioner GW Thompson to table this item, of a water truck purchase and collect more bids to get better prices. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Chairman Trim presented bids for the purchase of two motor graders. He then turned it over to Road Superintendent, Kenny Hicks to present the bids. Mr. Hicks stated there would be two separate bids as we are purchasing two motor graders. One with a trade and one without.

Mr. Murphy asked for explanation of the purchase option. It was explained by both representatives that the purchase option is the price the motor grader can be purchased for at

the end of 7 years or it can be turned in after 7 years and the County would not owe the purchase option amount.

Mr. Hicks recommended to the Board to proceed with the John Deere motor grader as the Purchase option is higher, the monthly payment and interest rate are lower than Caterpillar.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bubba Burkhalter and 2nd by Commissioner GW Thompson to accept the bid from Flint Equipment-John Deere for the purchase with trade in of a motor grader in the amount of \$196,546.00 with trade in, with payment of \$16,007.14 at a rate of 5.95%. Motion carried unanimously.

6. Mr. Hicks then presented second bid for a new motor grader with no trade. Mr. Hicks stated this is a straight buy as they County is turning in a motor grader that the lease has expired on. Bids are as follows:

Mr. Hicks recommended to the Board to proceed with the John Deere motor grader once again as the Purchase option is higher, the monthly payment and interest rate are lower than Caterpillar.

There was a motion by Commissioner GW Thompson and 2nd by Commissioner Bubba Burkhalter to accept the bid from Flint Equipment-John Deere for the purchase of the motor grader in the amount of \$249,546.00, with payment of \$24,991.38 at a rate of 5.95%. Motion carried unanimously.

7. Next on the agenda was Recognition of the Tattnall County Archives for being selected to receive the Georgia Historical Society's Roger K. Warlick Local History Achievement Award in the category of Special Project's for the "Revitalization of Tattnall County Archives".

Mr. Murphy apologized to the Board and stated he was informed by Mr. Pharris Johnson of Archives on Friday afternoon that the Georgia Historical Society will be presenting Tattnall County Archives with this award in August at the Commissioner's meeting.

Mr. Trim stated this item would be tabled for the August Commissioner's meeting.

There was a motion by Commissioner GW Thompson and 2nd by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy to table the Recognition of the Tattnall County Archives to the August Commissioner's meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

8. Mr. Murphy presented the new Hand's Free Driving Policy to be added to the personnel policy. This State law went into effect July 1, 2018. Mr. Murphy stated that a memo was sent to all employees to make them aware of the new law. Supervisors were also asked to hold a meeting with all employees to review the new policy and to have each employee sign stating acknowledgement.

Discussion was held on how policy effects law enforcement personnel. Law enforcement and first responders are exempt; however, they still need to use caution while driving and using a communication device.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bubba Burkhalter and 2nd by Commissioner GW Thompson to approve the Hand's Free Driving Policy and to add the policy to the Personnel policy. Motion carried unanimously.

Public Comments:

- 9. County Engineer, Dennis Odum, stated the LMIG for next year has been approved in the amount of \$960k which would cover 11-12 miles. This should be on next month's agenda for approval. Mr. Odum stated he would speak with each Commissioner about any roads they would like to be added to the list for paving. He also commented that more spot leveling needs to be completed and he will get with Mr. Murphy on this.
- 10. Mr. Murphy stated a called meeting would be needed for budgets, etc. later this month. Dates were discussed.
- 11. Ronnie McCall publicly thanked the Sheriff, Kyle Sapp, for his help with the VFW Boston butt sale.
- 12. Wayne Dasher updated that Onshore Outsourcing is now utilizing some rooms in the Technology building in Glennville. Mr. Dasher asked if early voting would be held in Glennville. Mr. Odum stated that there would not be early voting in Glennville. Glennville building would hold elections only on election day only.
- Mr. Dasher also invited all Commissioners to his Cabin on July 11th at 4 pm for a supporting fundraising event for Casey Cagle.

Mr. Dasher also stated that Tattnall County Development Authority is to meet with the Tattnall Investors Group/Zuber Malek on the development of a hotel/restaurant/pharmacy chain possibility, here in Reidsville.

Mr. Dasher then explained that the Tattnall County Development Authority has been approached by several businesses concerning alcohol sales on Sunday. The Development Authority will be meeting with these businesses and other local development authorities to discuss. Once date is set, he will invite the Commissioners.
