

Minutes  
December 2, 2019  
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Members Present: Chairman Jackie Trim, Commissioners Edward Kennedy, Bobby Kennedy, G.W. Thompson, Wayne Tatum and Bill Kicklighter.

Staff Present: County Manager Frank Murphy, County Clerk Christy D. McCall, County Engineer Dennis Odom, Road Superintendent Lynn Cribbs, EMA Director Walt Rogers, EMS Director Dustin Dasher, County Extension Agent Rachel Stewart and County Attorney Joseph McGovern.

Also, in attendance was Sheriff Kyle Sapp.

Chairman Trim called the Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Rev. Marc Foster gave the invocation. Chairman Trim then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Trim explained there was one item to add to the consent agenda which was a Construction easement from the Reidsville United Methodist Church which is needed to move forward on the Reidsville Plaza parking paving project. Chairman Trim asked for a motion to add this easement to the consent agenda.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner GW Thompson to add the Construction easement from the Reidsville United Methodist Church to the consent agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

There was a Motion by Commissioner GW Thompson and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter to approve the Consent Agenda as follows:

- 1) Regular Meeting Minutes **November 4, 2019**
- 2) Easement – Threlkeld
- 3) Easement – Reidsville United Methodist Church

Motion carried unanimously.

**New Business:**

- 1) Chairman Trim presented 2020 License Fees as follows:

Beer/Wine license - \$900.00 non-resident / \$800.00 resident  
Salvage - \$200.00  
Pawn - \$100.00

The fees remained the same as the prior year. There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Edward Kennedy to approve the 2020 License fees as referenced above. Motion carried unanimously.

- 2) Chairman Trim next presented the approval of 2020 County Holidays.

There was a motion by Commissioner Wayne Tatum and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter to approve the 2020 County Holidays. Motion carried unanimously.

3) Chairman Trim then presented Approval of 2020 Commissioner meeting dates. Each meeting will be held the first Monday of each month with the exception of the September meeting. Due the labor-day holiday, The September Commissioners meeting will be held the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday on September 14<sup>th</sup>.

There was a motion by Commissioner GW Thompson and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Wayne Tatum to approve the 2020 Commissioner meeting dates as referenced above. Motion carried unanimously.

4) Next was the Glennville Convenience Center Lease. Mr. Murphy stated that Collins Convenience Center lease was approved last year. He recommends continuing the Glennville Convenience Center lease with Eugene Eason.

There was a motion by Commissioner Wayne Tatum and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter to renew the Glennville Convenience Center Lease for a period of three years beginning January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

5) Reidsville Plaza parking lot resurfacing bids were then presented. Bids were as Follows:

UGMS General Construction	\$165,697.50
RB Baker	\$63,673.00
East Coast Asphalt, LLC	\$69,588.00
McLendon Enterprises	\$70,942.00
T & K Hicks Contracting	\$76,172.50

County Engineer, Dennis Odom, recommends the low bid from RB Baker in the amount of \$63,673.00. Mr. Odom pointed out that this was for the front parking lot section. He is still working on the plans for the back-parking lot. The bid came in lower than estimated.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner GW Thompson to accept and approve the low bid of \$63,673.00 from RB Baker. Motion carried unanimously.

6) Chairman Trim then presented appointment of Tattall County Industrial Development Authority (TCIDA) Member. He explained that Will Smith is the current Member representing the Reidsville Airport Authority. Mr. Smith is a full-time pilot and

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does not have enough time and recommends replacing himself with Ed Nelson, Owner of Rotary.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter to replace TCIDA member Will Smith with Ed Nelson. Motion carried unanimously.

7) Chairman Trim presented permission to surplus 2010 Chevrolet Ambulance, Vin#1GB9G5B61A1112680.

EMS Director, Dustin Dasher, explained that the department is looking to add a new ambulance to the fleet this year and would like to surplus the 2010 Ambulance currently used as a spare. The 2010 ambulance has 200k miles on it and has been the spare for quite a while now.

There was a motion by Commissioner GW Thompson and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Wayne Tatum to grant permission to surplus the 2010 Chevrolet Ambulance, Vin#1GB9G5B61A1112680. Motion carried unanimously.

8) Next on the agenda was the Resolution to transfer abandoned right of way of The Alexander Mill Pond Road.

County Engineer, Dennis Odom, explained that a portion of the Alexander Mill Pond Road was closed this past January. The owner of one portion, Mr. Brown, asked that the right of way be deeded back to him. The right of way is considered abandoned and will be added back to the tax roll.

Mr. Odom stated there is another owner of the closed portion of the Alexander Mill Pond Road, but he has not had a survey completed yet in order to transfer the right of way.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bobby Kennedy and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter to adopt the Resolution to transfer abandoned right of way of the Alexander Mill Pond Road to Joseph W. Brown and Kimberly A. Brown. Motion carried unanimously.

9) FY2020 Spot leveling was then presented by Mr. Odom. Mr. Odom explained That he has a list of areas that need spot leveling this year. The estimated total of spot leveling to be completed is \$97,752.00. Mr. Odom further explained that other spots may come up during the year.

Mr. Murphy stated that \$100k was budgeted for spot leveling for this fiscal year.

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There was a motion by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Wayne Tatum to approve the FY2020 Spot leveling estimate list in the amount of \$97,752.00. Motion carried unanimously.

**Public Comments:**

10) Wayne Dasher, Chairman of the Tattnall County Industrial Development Authority (TCIDA) stated that during the last TCIDA meeting, the members voted unanimously to request for Commissioners to put Sunday Alcohol Sales on the ballot. Mr. Dasher explained that the City of Reidsville has already done this along with package sales and it was passed. He further explained that this would apply to everything outside the incorporated areas of Tattnall County and each City would have to request it to be put on the ballot if they wished to do so. He stated he was not trying to do anything that has not already been done in surrounding counties.

Discussion was held pertaining to when it would need to be placed on the ballot. It was determined the Board of Elections would need an approved resolution by January 10<sup>th</sup> to be placed on the ballot during the Presidential election. The item that will be placed specifically on the ballot is 1) Pouring for restaurants that serve at least 50 percent prepared meals, 2) Sunday sales after 12 noon, specifically beer and wine to go, 3) Sunday Brunch sales at 11 am for pouring. Questions also arose concerning pouring as to whether it would be liquor or wine pour. It was determined it could be either. Any drink that could be poured.

Chairman Trim asked for clarification of what was being asked. Chairman of the TCIDA, Wayne Dasher, explained that the TCIDA is recommending that the Commissioners place Sunday Alcohol Sales to include 1) Pouring for restaurants that serve at least 50 percent prepared meals, 2) Sunday sales after 12 noon, specifically beer and wine to go, 3) Sunday Brunch sales at 11 am for pouring on the ballot. A resolution would need to be approved and sent to the Board of Election by January 10<sup>th</sup> to be placed on the ballot during the Presidential election. The people will have to vote on the item.

There was a motion by Commissioner Bill Kicklighter and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner GW Thompson to adopt a resolution calling for Sunday alcohol sales to include 1) Pouring for restaurants that serve at least 50 percent prepared meals, 2) Sunday sales after 12 noon, specifically beer and wine to go, 3) Sunday Brunch sales at 11 am for pouring to be placed on the ballot during the Presidential election. Motion carried unanimously.

11) Mayor of Reidsville, Sydney Clifton, inquired about tires at the Convenience Center. He stated that the abundance of tires is a breeding ground for mosquitos, and he thought the tires were to be removed every 90 days. Chairman Trim stated that he would look into this.

12) Pam Waters of the Journal Sentinel reminded everyone of the Celebration of the

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
Season event to be held December 6<sup>th</sup> in Glennville from 4:00-7:30 p.m.


